



Christian Action Network Bio Martin J. Mawyer – President and Founder & President of PRB Films

Martin J. Mawyer is the president and founder of Christian Action Network (CAN), a non-profit organization dedicated to protecting the traditions of the American family and defending the nation against radical Islam. An activist in the religious community for over three decades, Mawyer began as a freelance journalist for various Christian publications and then served as editor of Jerry Falwell’s “Moral Majority Report.”

Mawyer has authored three books: *Defending the American Family: The Pro-Family Contract with America*, *Silent Shame: The Alarming Rise of Child Sexual Abuse* and *Pathways to Success: First Steps for Becoming a Christian in Action*.

Since its inception in 1989, CAN has strongly supported the right to life for the unborn and voluntary prayer in public schools to restore religious liberties; has lobbied in favor of legislation that defends traditional marriage; has worked to expose “Gay Days at Walt Disney World” to protect children and families; and has advocated an end to taxpayer-funded “hate art” through the National Endowment for the Arts.

Under Mawyer’s leadership, CAN has become one of the nation’s leading grassroots Christian political organizations with more than 250,000 active members.

Mawyer’s numerous television and radio appearances include: CNN’s Larry King Live, CNN’s Sonya Live and Talk Back Live, NBC’s Today Show, NBC’s Entertainment Tonight, C-SPAN’s Viewer Call-In, FOX’s Morning News, FOX’s Hannity & Colmes and FOX’s The O’Reilly Factor, Pat Robertson’s 700 Club, Jerry Falwell’s Pastor’s Study and Dr. D. James Kennedy’s Coral Ridge Ministries.

Ryan Mauro – National Security Researcher

Ryan Mauro is the Associate Director of the Center for the Defense of Western Interests and is the Christian Action Network's National Security Researcher as well as one of the authors of their Weekly Terrorism Spotlight. He founded WorldThreats.com, which analyzes the latest events in foreign affairs affecting U.S. security.

At the age of 16, Mauro was hired as a geopolitical analyst for Tactical Defense Concepts, a maritime-related security group, believed to be the youngest hired geopolitical analyst in the country at that time. Mauro's reports, which often criticized both political spectrums for their approaches to national security and geopolitics, were often forwarded to members of the law enforcement and intelligence communities.

In June 2003, Mauro founded WorldThreats.com to promote news and analysis and has done volunteer research work for the Reform Party of Syria, a group dedicated to bringing democracy to their country.

In 2005, Mauro published his first book, *Death to America: The Unreported Battle of Iraq* about Iraqi weapons of mass destruction (and their possible movement to other countries), involvement with terrorism, how Iran and Syria were engineering the insurgency in Iraq, and the geopolitics of the Middle East as a whole.

Mauro is also an associate editor for American Foreign Policy and the Middle East at GlobalPolitician.com and a U.S. editor at the World Security Network. He also co-founded the International Analyst Network, a Facebook-like website for readers to follow their favorite analysts and writers. He has also used his wide range of sources to break front-page stories on WorldNetDaily.com

Mauro is frequently a guest on talk radio and TV, such as the left's "Al Franken Show" and the right's "Dennis Prager Show." He has also had speaking engagements at the prestigious Intelligence Summit, colleges and political clubs.

Mauro is currently creating a ghost-writing company and is pursuing a Bachelor's in Intelligence Studies and a Master's in Political Science at American Military University. He currently resides in Wall Township, NJ.
